The **Kit and Caboodle Thrift Store**, affectionately referred to as "the Kit" has been around since 1971 and is





Lighting Project Saves Bucks

Last fall we took part in Tillamook PUD's Commercial Lighting Program. All interior lighting fixtures were retrofitted to be energy efficient at our Front Street Facility. It is projected that our program will save 27,000 KW

annually. This project cost \$9,111 to complete. With the PUD rebate of \$6,378, the net cost to MMCI was \$2,733. We are happy to say that within only 1 year the savings will have paid for this project.
