#### **Employment Path Solo**

"Solo" offers opportunities for individuals to explore options and possibilities in the employment world with an employment professional on a 1:1 basis. We all know everyone is unique and this program is based on individual needs, each session is used to improve skills while exploring interests. After 60 days, preliminary exploration is revisited to determine whether the program is meeting expectations. The ultimate goal for each participant, of course, is to find a job. Our Employment Services team works in conjunction with this program to provide job coaching, creating a successful finale for both employer and the individual.

Services could include: Weekly Contacts/ Employment Visits/Exploration; Bus Training; Basic Skill Building; Communication Skill Building; Application/Resume Assistance and Inter-
